## Principles to remember when wagering at the track by Phillip W. Weiss

- 1. How a horse will perform during a race is unpredictable.
- 2. Understand and master the basic laws of probability.
- 3. Past performance is no predictor of future outcome.
- 4. Bet to win, not to make money.
- 5. Keep bets simple.
- 6. Become familiar with meet statistics.
- 7. Develop a habit of picking winners.
- 8. Heavy favorites can and often lose.
- 9. Heavy longshots can and often win.
- 10. Odds posted prior to a race have no bearing on outcome.
- 11. Be sober.
- 12. Winning horses lose.
- 13. Losing horses win.
- 14. Bet small.
- 15. Bet conservatively.
- 16. Do not treat horse racing like casino gambling.
- 17. Learn to appreciate the esthetics of horse racing.
- 18. Learn the fundamentals of horse racing.
- 19. Respect the work of the jockeys, trainers, handlers, etc.
- 20. Understand that in any given race the difference between finishing first place and last place is usually less than 2 seconds.
- 21. Understand that on any given day any well-trained race horse in good health can win any race.
- 22. Be sober.
- 23. Refrain from consuming tobacco products.
- 24. Celebrate after picking a winner, not before.
- 25. Take betting seriously.
- 26. Respect the horses as well-trained athletes.
- 27. No one can force a horse to run.
- 28. Closely observe the horses in the paddock and on parade.
- 29. Aim to win but be prepared to lose.
- 30. Take horse racing seriously.
- 31. Be thankful for having the capability and resources to be a player.
- 32. Understand that winning a horse race is one of the most difficult feats to accomplish in sports.
- 33. Understand that the odds of a foal becoming a winning race horse is several thousand to one.
- 34. NEVER take picking a win for granted.
- 35. Understand that picking a winner has to do with luck.
