

United Nations, Israel, and Anti-Semitism

Based upon the comments made by representatives of various nations in the response to a recent draft resolution submitted by the United States to the United Nations Security Council, it is apparent beyond ALL DOUBT that the United Nations, whose mission is to advance the cause of peace, is as a matter of policy hostile to Israel and is doing everything it can to isolate and destroy Israel. Further, while it is unclear whether the UN's hostility is political or driven by sheer anti-Semitism, what is absolutely certain is that UN member states are using the current war in the Mideast as a pretext to score political points at the expense of the United States, which at the UN is being characterized as vacillating on its desire for peace and acting in bad faith and giving a green light for Israel to wantonly target civilians.

The United Nations has demonstrated its utter inability to put aside its longstanding hostility to Israel to seriously address the issues that led up to the current war. What is most alarming however is the steadfast refusal of the United Nations to condemn Hamas for its actions which started the current war. While the United Nations does demand that Hamas release its hostages, it does not demand that Hamas cease its war against Israel, does not demand that Hamas cease its publicly stated vow to physically annihilate Israel, and does not demand that Hamas recognize Israel's right to exist. Hence, unless Israel agrees to the

United Nation's wish for Israel to cease defending itself, all efforts by the United Nations to bring peace to the Mideast region are doomed to failure and are a complete waste of time.

That could change, however, if the United Nations puts aside politics and deals with the situation in the Mideast with impartiality and objectivity. While that is asking a lot from an organization that is totally corrupted by politics, anti-Semitism, and anti-Americanism, and has become a platform from which to impugn the United States, nevertheless sometimes miracles do happen, and maybe the United Nations will undergo a dramatic change of heart. But don't hold your breath while waiting for that to happen.

Whatever the case, the US abandonment of Israel marks a radical shift of US foreign policy away from Israel and toward Israel's enemies. This shift places US foreign policy on a new course, into uncharted waters, the consequences of which only time will tell. There are unmistakable signs that the world is heading toward a new world war. A similar erosion of alliances occurred leading up to the start of World War Two. Hitler saw what he believed was a breakdown of resolve on the part of the British and French and took that as a green light to invade Poland.

Today, other nations may see the breakdown of US resolve as a green light to finally take decisive action to destroy Israel and the United States. The recent UN security council resolution calling for an unconditional ceasefire is a further show of international hostility to Israel and US weakness. No nation really cares

whether Israel exists. Even the United States really doesn't care. The world will easily accommodate itself to a world without Israel. The US no longer has the strength or resolve to provide unconditional support for Israel. All the US firepower does nothing to deter countries from attacking Israel. The US is now trying to build relationships with countries like Saudi Arabia and even Iran. That shift comes at a price, the price being to cease supporting Israel. The US shift away from Israel is driven by the demographic changes occurring in the United States. In the United States, new and huge blocs of voters have emerged. These new blocs of voters have their roots in various Third World countries that couldn't care less about Israel. East Asians, southeast Asians, Indians, Chinese, and Pakistanis have absolutely no bond with Israel. And when we include the millions of black and Hispanic voters who also couldn't care less about Israel, then the reason for the US shift of policy becomes obvious.

This is part of the process of change. Some may call this change a disaster. If so, then the US is courting disaster, but that is what happens when a nation no longer has the strength to confront its enemies and is forced to act out of expediency. Whatever the case, the US is in decline. The US can't even clear the subway of vagrants, can't even police its own borders. The whole world sees this and should not be surprising if, sensing US weakness, other nations start to extort concessions from the United States.
