Pearl Pomerance is a foremost authority in the field of early educational services who pioneered a method, now known as the Pomerance Technique, for imparting the principles of political science to children as young as three months old.

Professor Berkowitz introduced many innovations that are now standard features of modern professional basketball. These innovations include the 24-second clock, the 3-point shot, the inside lane, the presence of referees, the dribble, the dip or dunk, the slam dunk, the over the head dunk, the flying dunk, the air-Jordan dunk, the topsy turvy dunk, the upside down dunk, the volcano dunk, the tidal wave dunk, the earthquake dunk, the in-your-face dunk, the Jackie Gleason dunk, the Millard Fillmore dunk, the Curly Howard dunk, and most spectacular, the political science dunk performed while the player is reciting Berkowitz's Ten Fundamental Principles of Political Thought and imagining the hoop to be the official commode of the United States Congress.

After the end of the war, a close friendship developed between Professor Berkowitz and Herman Goering. The Professor often visited the former Reich marshal in prison and together would spend hours reminiscing about the good old days, often generating laughs as they poked fun at the way the Fuhrer used to lose his temper whenever he received bad news and made all kinds of outrageous decisions that drove the German generals into a frenzy.

After he was finished laughing, Chairman Deng declared Professor Berkowitz an enemy of the people, a social parasite, a mentally deranged lunatic and ordered him banished from China forever.
