

In a city as wealthy as New York City, that any New Yorkers should feel even the slightest level of dissatisfaction with their quality of life in the city is a

Yet polls show that only a small fraction of voters in New York City are happy with the quality of life in the city. According to a poll of New York City voters conducted by Quinnipiac University, only 5 percent of the voters polled reported that they were “very satisfied” with the way things are going in New York City today. The other 95 percent reported various levels of dissatisfaction. Within that 95 percent, a whopping 46 percent reported that they were either “somewhat dissatisfied” or “very dissatisfied” with the way things are going in New York City.
